Growing Food in The Wet Tropics in November/December

Time to plant the tropical perennial veggies if you haven’t already. Okinawa, Sambung, Brazilian, Kang Kong, Amaranth, Tree lettuce, Talium, Lebanese cress, Ceylon Spinach, arrowroot, taro, cocoyam to name a few.

&

Time to seed corn, cucumbers, guada bean, snake beans, rocket, bok choy, open leaf lettuce, sweet potatoes, pumpkin, corn.

&

It is time to plant a green manure crop on your open ground. Microbes need roots to live on so plant mung beans, sorghum, millet, buckwheat, mustard, radish, daikon radish.

Check out the Asian food shops for seeds, and budgie food in the supermarkets, all good for growing now.

Compost all your waste, don’t let it off your property.
